## I. LIST OF END-TIMES PASSAGES FROM THE NEW TESTAMENT

- A. I encourage us as believers to develop a reading plan that focuses on the following end-times passages of the New Testament. These passages are complete chapters of the New Testament that contain at least 50% of the chapter focuses on various aspects of end-times.
- B. The Book of Revelation goes as far to tell us that there is a blessing for reading, keeping and hearing the contents of that book. It is a principle for all scripture but especially the end-times passages.
- <sup>3</sup> Blessed is he who <u>reads</u> and those who <u>hear</u> the words of this prophecy, and <u>keep</u> those things which are written in it; for the time is near. Rev. 1: 3
- C. We want to relate to Jesus in all aspects of his character and nature so that we learn to love him in all aspects of who he is.
- D. Suggestions:
  - 1. Create a reading plan. Take a day a week where you focus your reading on end-times passages. Include some type of fasting as this will help your focus.
  - 2. Get to know the scriptures regardless of how well you understand them.
  - 3. Look for common repetitive statements throughout the chapters.
  - 4. Look for common trends or signs you see listed in scripture, already in operation on the earth right now.
  - 5. Keep record of your questions in a question journal. Write down any of the questions given in the end-times scriptures.

## III. COMMON STRUCTURES OF PROPHETIC END-TIMES SCRIPTURES

- A. Most end-times scriptures have three common components to their structure. Though this is not true of all of them, it is a common observation for a significant number of them. The three common components are:
  - 1. **Revelation**—meaning what content we have been shown. I am not talking about the book of Revelation per se, but the fact that most end-times passages have a revelation from the spiritual realm given to someone that they are to proclaim or record for all to know.
  - 2. **Interpretation**—seeks to give us understanding as to the meaning of the content received in the revelation.
  - 3. *Application*—calls us to respond in some way in our relationship with God.
